

John Windhausen President Telepoly

John Windhausen, Jr. is the founder of <u>Telepoly</u>, an online portal of information and analysis of broadband policy issues. He is the former Executive Director of the Schools, Health & Libraries Broadband (SHLB) Coalition a public interest advocacy organization based in Washington DC. He founded SHLB in 2009 and stepped down in April 2025.

Mr. Windhausen was formerly the president of a telecommunications trade association and served as General Counsel of a public interest group called the Competition Policy Institute. Before that, he served for nine years as staff counsel for the U. S. Senate Commerce Committee (led by Senator Ernest Fritz Hollings and Senator Daniel Inouye), where he participated in drafting the Telecommunications Act of 1996. He began his career as a staff attorney at the Federal Communications Commission in 1984. He has a B.A. from Yale University and a J.D. from the UCLA School of Law.
